Krzysztof Jasiewicz

Professor at the Institute of the Political Studies of the Polish Academy of Sciences. He graduated from organization and management studies at the Cracow Academy of Economics (currently Cracow University of Economics), where he also received Juris Doctor degree in political economics. Postdoctoral degree in political science at the Institute of the Political Sciences of the Polish Academy of Sciences (first postdoctoral degree awarded by the Institute, holder of the diploma no 1); professor in the humanities (modern history) in 2005.

Throughout his career Krzysztof Jasiewicz worked in the Cracow Academy of Economics, Main School of Planning and Statistics (currently Warsaw School of Economics and in the Polish Academy of Sciences, Autonomous Working Group of the History of the Eastern Lands of the II Republic of Poland directed by prof. Tomasz Strzembosz, currently Department of Analysis of Eastern Issues of the Institute of the Political Studies of the Polish Academy of Sciences. Krzysztof Jasiewicz has carried out research on the history of the Eastern Lands during the Second World War, Katyń massacre and the history of the Soviet Union. He led queries in the archives of Belarus, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia, Moldova, Russia and Ukraine as well as in the United Kingdom (London: Studium Polski Podziemnej, Archives of the Sikorski Institute, Piłsudski Archives in London and Public Record Office in London).
