Professor **Dariusz Stola** is a historian at the ISP PAN Department of Contemporary Political History, currently on an extended leave serving as the director of the Museum of the History of Polish Jews.

He has published ten books and more than hundred articles on the history of Polish-Jewish relations, the communist regime in Poland and on international migrations in the 20th century, including: *Nadzieja i zagłada* (1995) [*Hope and the Holocaust*]; *Kampania antysyjonistyczna w Polsce 1967-1968* (2000) [*The Anti-Zionist Campaign in Poland*, 1967-1968]; *Kraj bez wyjścia? Migracje z Polski 1949-1989* (2010) [*A Country with No Exit? Migrations from Poland*, 1949-1989; *Patterns of Migration in Central Europe* (2001, with C. Wallace); *PZPR jako machina władzy* (2012, with K. Persak) [*Polish Communist Party as a Ruling Machine*].

His books received several awards, while he was awarded the Knight's Cross of the Order of Polonia Restituta for his contribution to research on Poland's history. He serves on advisory boards of several Polish and international institutions, including the International Auschwitz Council.
